Catching the Pastor's Vision

Objective:

To gain an insight and understanding of how to embrace and run with the vision of the senior pastor.

Where does the vision come from?

The origin of everything is God. He will place a passion in the heart of a person for people. In the passion, God gives vision. If we are going to have a ministry and operate in the authority that God has given to us, then we must first have passion. We must have a burning desire to fulfill whatever task God has assigned for us to do in our lives. No matter what, I must know my task.

Who is the vision given to?

The vision comes from God and is given to a set man. As God speaks to the passion already in the man, He gives him a vision. This places a burden on the man because his drive in life is to fulfill the vision of God. As the vision becomes larger, God anoints him, appoints him and places people around him to help fulfill that vision.

Nehemiah 4:6-15

God gave Nehemiah a passion for his people. He got a report that the walls were down and God stirred up a passion in Nehemiah for His purpose. His passion was that the walls of the city were down. He got a burden. Walls were built for protection of everything in the city. Today, the walls are torn down. We are to build up the wall of Kingdom Principles. We are to teach and preach the Kingdom in every sphere of life so that all the people may live out those principles in their lives. Without the walls of the Kingdom, the city is undefended against its enemies. Today, we see marriages ending in divorce, both in and outside the church. We see citizens of other kingdoms (Muslims) leading the people of God. There is a leadership crisis in our society; there are third trimester abortions and financial despair. The youth are crying for direction and love. Society is crumbling, all because the Kingdom Walls are torn down.

Nehemiah the Visionary

Nehemiah was a cupbearer to the king. When the news came about the walls, he got a burden, prayed and God gave him a new assignment. He practically became a prophet and a pastor of the church of Jerusalem.

As those running with a vision, we must remember one word of wisdom. The vision get smaller and smaller as it is communicated down. God saw the nation, the pastor saw a city, and the people saw torn down walls. We must be careful not to think we see more than God's set man. We must bring the details to the vision and make it all that God desires it to be.

Carrying the Vision

The main problems with the visions are distractions. As long as we are off focus we will never fulfill the vision of God. The visionary understands that the work is so valuable that, even in our love for him, we can unintentionally be getting off task. The greatest problem comes from the words of those around us. We as carriers of the vision must be careful not to allow murmuring, complaining, down talking, etc. to get us off track and off focus. The deepest hurts come not from those who talk on the outside, but when those on the inside begin to rise against the vision.

Amos 3:7

God reveals his secrets to His servants, the prophets. The church cannot do anything until the prophet of the house speaks. If it is not spoken, then it's not yet for the appointed time.

Nehemiah 4:13

Nehemiah set the people according to their tribes, with swords, spears and bows. The pastor did not get encumbered with all of the day-to-day activities of the vision. He spoke to the noble leaders and then the people. The visionary speaks to the leaders and then the people. His job is to stay before God and impart to the leaders to help equip the saints to fulfill the vision. (Eph 4:11-12)

Nehemiah did not set the people on the wall without any tools. They had what they needed to get the job done. He put them in position because he understood that with the walls being down, the voice would try to come through the wall. So he put a counseling man right there. He knew There were a million children that needed to hear and he spoke unto his leaders so that they would stand in the gap. We don't need to mix ourselves. We are a pure seed. He gave them what they needed: God had already gifted them

As leaders and members, we bring our gift to serve the vision. The vision lies in the man — the visionary. Your gifts belong to the vision of the house to bless the house and make the vision come to pass.

People are placed in positions based on talents primarily. They are placed because of faithfulness. Even within faithfulness, a time of proving was necessary. Nehemiah put some on the lower part of the wall first. That is where menial tasks are...scrubbing toilets, emptying trash, etc. the proving comes after three months to a year. This is a time of watching what is going to be said. If they are anxious to get "their" turn, they may not be ready to assume added responsibility. If people are looking for their turn and want their own, then they are slaves. A slave works to be free. They want to be free to do their own thing with their gifts. These are the same gifts that God gave to fulfill the vision.

Faithful saints will do the same things the visionary needs done to accomplish the vision. The saints are the hands, arms, legs and shoulders of the body. When God's established order is in place, challenges come to the lower places of the wall. That is the place where we need to be most on guard. In the lower place, I have a sword and a brick. I build and defend at the same time

Historical Highlights Of Greater Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church 1891 — 2012

The church that was the marvel of the City of Birmingham was Shiloh Baptist Church under Rev. T. W. Walker. This church was organized May 3, 1891 as a result of preaching supported by a society known as the "Christian Relief Association." The original structure was one story. Later, the spirit filled young church built on Nineteenth Street and Avenue G. It was a striking structure with a capacity of 3000. At that time, it was the largest congregation in the city. Often when the house was filled to capacity, a good part of the streets were filled with persons who were anxious to approach near enough to hear. Of course the Pastor was the source and center of this successful church. He was fortunate in drawing about him some very business-like people; J. W. Sampson and J. M. Ross.

On September 19, 1902, Shiloh was headquarters for the 22nd Annual National Baptist Convention of Negro Baptist Preachers. The keynote speaker was Booker T. Washington. He had just finished his address when a choir loft cry of "fight" was misinterpreted as "fire" erupted into a stampede in which 120 persons died.

In 1915, our Church housed a school, grades kindergarten through fourth. Teachers were Mrs. T. W. Walker, Ms. Julia Driver, Ms. Alice Bell, Ms. Adele McCall, and Mrs. Annie Peters.

After Rev. Walker left the church, Rev. Albert Garner (1918—1935) became the Pastor of the congregation. Under his administration the following officers served: J. W. Sampson, James A. Taylor, F. L. Brown, R. T. Parker, J. W. Rhome, J. R. Banks, S. A. Ball, D. S. Bee, A. J. Cook, Steiner Taylor, G. V. Givens, W. M. Anthony, and S. W. Wiggins. The church's site was rezoned for business. It was sold and the church located on Fourteenth Street and Avenue G. Two temporary structures, one for storage and one for worship were constructed. The basement of the brick structure was ready for worship in 1927.

Rev. Walter Wilson (1936—February 1949) our third Pastor, liquidated the church indebtedness and planned for the upper level construction. The depression and other factors caused the name of the church to become Greater Shiloh.

Rev. Allen Thomas (July 1949 — 1988), our fourth Pastor, was a dynamic productive leader who proved that God specializes in things that seem impossible. The upper level of the church was competed with Opening and Dedicatory Services held October 22 — 29, 1961 and Cornerstone Laying November 26, 1961. Spiritual, financial and numerical growth continued. The church was forced to move to our present location at 1616 — 18th Place Southwest, as a result of the Medical Center expansion. Dedicatory and Opening services were May 4, 1969.

The church continued to prosper under the leadership of Rev. Allen Thomas until his health began to fail. At that time (1985) God inspired the church to call Rev. Michael W. Wesley, Sr. as Assistant Pastor. He served faithfully in this capacity until the retirement of Rev. Thomas (1900). The spirit moved in on the hearts of the officers and members to continue leadership of the young dynamic, spirit-filled, multi-talented servant.

Under the leadership of Rev. Wesley (1988 -), who in 2006 became Dr. Wesley having earned a Doctor of Ministry Degree from Louisiana Baptist University and Theological Seminary, the church has continued to grow. The hallmark of his leadership has been vision and strategic focused. The new century has been a period of transition.

- Goal Greater Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church had definitely regained its outward, missionary focus. We have transitioned from an internally focused church to an outward focused church that is very concerned for others, the lost, the disadvantaged as well as those at the other end of the spectrum that also need God.
- Approach Our approach to ministry has transitioned from a program and personality driven church to a purpose driven model of church. The five purposes of God as outlined in the scriptures are what drives the church.
- We have launched the development of and the implementation of an annual Leadership School designed to provide current and future church leaders with understanding and skill for various ministry opportunities.
- We have adopted another Biblical Process Model that has made a vast difference. We now use a model called C.L.A.S.S. We seek to attract lost people through both. They are encouraged to move through a series of discipleship classes: (Class 101: Discovering Church Membership; Class 201: Introduction to Spiritual Maturity; Class 301: Introduction to Your SHAPE; and Class 401: Discovering My Life Mission) to grow their understanding and become equipped to serve in an area of ministry.
- November 30, 2008 we moved into a new 37,000 square foot multi-million dollar facility.
- Worship Style We have transitioned from a strictly traditional style of worship to a blended contemporary worship style. We have changed the instrumentation of instruments and style music used. There is also an increase in a variety of contemporary music, some even bordering on jazz or gospel rock, thus a blend of both. We are also using video screens.
- This strategic planning process has led to phenomenal growth. Our new strategic plan is, "The next five, our best five". These words represent our church family's personal intention to give God the best that we have over the next five years. There is a clarion call of urgency for us to focus our collective efforts to see to it that God's will is carried out to the very last detail.
- The vision is outlined in our five year master plan. We will cause change in countless numbers of people lives. We will continue to pursue those who are far removed from God, lead them into a saving relationship with Him and help them become lifelong devoted followers of Jesus. In addition, the physical look of our campus will change as we will engage in capital projects that include some of the following: provide much needed additional parking; expand the seating capacity of our sanctuary; add additional classroom spaces; enlarge our chapel; provide a new bus for transportation; increase storage spaces; purchase additional property; see to it that appropriate affordable housing is constructed on the adjacent property; establish and build a community center and medical center.

- Greater Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church's future is extremely bright. We will continue to make transitions and phenomenal growth. Here are a few reasons our future looks so bright:
 - Core Ministry Strong preaching and clear teaching will remain at the center of what draws and will continue to draw people to faith in Christ.
 - > Approach We will continually refine our approach.
 - Farget We are no longer just an African American Church, we have already become multicultural. Television will also be a tool used to help reach our target audience.
 - > Schedule We will add more weekend services as the growth takes place.
 - Structure We are using lay directors to direct the five biblical functions of the church as defined in our vision statement and the teams that fall under each. We will ordain or hire pastors who can shepherd these teams.
 - > Small Groups Affinity small groups will become the main source of delivering curriculum and causing people to live in community with each other.

With the continued guidance of God, a strategic focus, a love for lost people and a willingness to empower others to carry out the work of ministry, we will maintain that missionary zeal. We have gained a momentum that we must now harness and allow it to power us through the next few years.

At Greater Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church, we wait until our children are old enough to believe and understand the true meaning of baptism before we baptize them.

Some churches practice a "baptism of confirmation" for children. This ceremony is intended to be a covenant between the parents and God on the behalf of the child. The parents promise to raise their child in the faith until the child is old enough to make his own personal confession of Christ. This custom began about 300 years after the Bible was completed. **This is different from the baptism talked about in the Bible**, which was only for those old enough to believe. The purpose is to publicly confess your personal commitment to Christ.

At Greater Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church, it is a membership requirement that every member must have been baptized the way Jesus demonstrated, even though many of us were "confirmed" as children.

V. WHEN SHOULD I BE BAPTIZED?

AS SOON AS YOU HAVE BELIEVED!

"Those who believed...were baptized...that day!" Acts 2:41

"Then Philip began with the scripture and told him the Good News about Jesus. As they traveled along the road, they came to some water, and the man said, 'Look, here is water! Why shouldn't I be baptized right now?' Philip said, 'If you believe with all your heart, you may.' The man answered, 'I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.' So they went down into the water and Philip baptized him." Acts 8:35-38

There is no reason to delay. As soon as you have decided to receive Christ into your life, you can and should be baptized. If you wait until you are "perfect", you'll never feel "good enough"!

CAN MY FAMILY BE BAPTIZED TOGETHER?

Yes! If each family member understands fully the meaning of baptism, and each one has personally placed his/her trust in Christ for salvation, we encourage families to be baptized at the same time. It is a wonderful expression of commitment.

However, it is important to remember that baptism is a *personal* statement of faith, not a family tradition. It is usually not wise to delay your baptism while waiting on other family members to accept Christ, particularly children. This puts an undue pressure on them, and delays *your* obedience.

WHAT SHOULD I WEAR WHEN I AM BAPTIZED?

You will be provided a letter that will detail items needed. However the church does furnish baptismal gowns for both male and female candidates. Bring a change of clothes, towel, and a plastic bag for your wet clothes. We provide changing rooms.

WILL I HAVE TO SAY ANYTHING?

No. At the beginning of the service, Pastor Wesley or a designee will briefly explain the meaning of baptism. You will wait at the edge of the pool for your turn to be baptized. Pastor Wesley or a designee will briefly lower you just under the water, and then you can leave the pool, dry off. Later you will be mailed a certificate of your baptism. We encourage you to invite all your relatives and friends to attend your baptism.

SPECIAL NEEDS?

All of our Pastors can perform a private baptism in special circumstances.

THE MEANING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Jesus never asked His disciples to remember His birth. But He did instruct them to remember His death and resurrection. He gave the church two visible symbols (called "ordinances") as reminders of His death. These two ordinances are: Baptism and The Lord's Supper. The Lord's Supper is an object lesson that represents a great spiritual truth for believers.

IV. WHEN AND HOW OFTEN SHOULD WE OBSERVE THE LORD'S SUPPER?

Jesus never said when or how often believers should observe The Lord's Supper. He said "...this do in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19b). Paul further instructed us by writing "For as often as ye eat this bread and drink this cup of the Lord, ye do show (that is you remember) the Lord's death until He comes." (1 Cor. 11:26). Jesus did institute it on a Thursday night. Since it is a 'supper', it may seem more appropriate to observe it at an evening service.

However, we usually take The Lord's Supper on the first Sunday of each month at each of the Sunday morning services. Other times we may observe it would include Special Services, Convocations, in the future perhaps at our midweek service, at retreats, banquets and in small groups,

BIBLE AS OUR SOLE AUTHORITY

Since God's Word is the only completely reliable and truthful authority, we accept the Bible as our manual for living. Our first question when faced with a decision is "What does the Bible say?" We practice daily Bible reading, Bible study, and Bible memorization. The Bible is the basis for all we believe.

AUTONOMY OF EACH LOCAL CHURCH

"Christ is the head of His Body, the church. He is the source of the Body's life..." Col. 1:18 (GN)

Christ is the recognized head of our church, not any person, group, or religious organization. While recognizing the value of associating and cooperating with other groups of Christians, we believe every local church should be self-governing and independent from any denominational control. In relating to our "daughter churches" that we sponsor, we encourage each congregation to determine it's own strategy, structure, and style.

PRIESTHOOD OF EVERY BELIEVER

"Christ loves us, and by His death He has freed us from our sins and made us a <u>kingdom of priests</u> to serve God..." Rev. 1:6 (GN) "You are..<u>.the King's priests</u>...God's own people, chosen to proclaim the wonderful acts of God." 1 Pet. 2:9 (GN)

The Bible teaches that every Christian is called to "full time" Christian service, regardless of his or her vocation. We practice the truth that every believer is a minister by encouraging every member to find a place of service and ministry. Every believer has direct access to God through prayer Bible reading.

OUR AFFILIATION

The Number One Conference of The Mount Pilgrim District Association

The Number One Conference is the group of churches that we are a part of within the Birmingham cluster of churches known as the Mt. Pilgrim District. Mt. Pilgrim sponsors local educational conferences, community projects, and other events on behalf of its members.

The Alabama Baptist State Convention

This convention is the Statewide Convention that unites more than 1,500 churches that fellowship together with the goal of evangelizing our state. The State of Alabama is divided into four major geographical areas: Northeast District, Northwest District, Southeast District, and Southwest District. Each major District has within it smaller districts that provide Christian Education and training to its member churches.

The National Baptist Convention USA

It is the oldest and largest religious convention of the African American churches in the United States that cooperates together in worldwide effort of missions, preaching, teaching, and healing. The convention's membership is estimated at 7.5 million members.

The Willow Creek Association (WCA)

This association is a worldwide network of over 9,800 churches from more than 90 denominations that works to equip and encourage Christian leaders to build biblically functioning churches that reach increasing numbers to unchurched people with the gospel.

WHY NOT JUST BE AN INDEPENDENT CHURCH?

We are an independent church! Every Baptist church is completely independent. There is no denominational control or hierarchy, as there are in most other denominations. Each church is self-governed and determines its own affairs.

For example:

- Every Baptist church chooses its own pastor
- Every Baptist church owns its own buildings and assets
- Every Baptist church determines its own programs

WHAT ARE THE ADVANTAGES OF AFFILIATING WITH THE ASSOCIATIONS?

- 1. It allows us to **identify with other Christians** around the world who are known for their commitment to the Bible. Unlike other groups, the SBC has no man-made "creed". The Bible is our only authority.
- 2. It allows our church to participate in the largest missionary organization in the world. Through the SBC "Cooperative Program" we help support over 7,500 missionaries in 104 countries around the world.

WHAT IT MEANS TO BE A MEMBER

The difference between "attenders" and "members" can be summed up in one word:

At Greater Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church we recognize the need for a formal membership. We ask you to commit to membership for four reasons:

I. A BIBLICAL REASON:

CHRIST IS COMMITTED TO THE CHURCH

"... Christ loved the church, and he gave his life for it." Eph. 5:25

II. A CULTURAL REASON:

IT IS AN ANTIDOTE TO OUR SOCIETY

We live in an age where very few want to be committed to anything...a job...a marriage...our country. This attitude has even produced a generation of "church shoppers and hoppers". Membership swims against the current of America's "consumer religion." It is an unselfish decision. Commitment always builds character.

III. A PRACTICAL REASON:

IT DEFINES WHO CAN BE COUNTED ON

Every team must have a roster. Every school must have an enrollment. Every business has a payroll. Every army has an enlistment. Even our country takes a census and requires voter registration. Membership identifies our family.

IV. A PERSONAL REASON:

IT PRODUCES SPIRITUAL GROWTH

The New Testament places a major emphasis on the need for Christians to be accountable to each other for spiritual growth. You cannot be accountable when you're not committed to any specific church family.

WHAT IS EXPECTED OF ME AS A MEMBER?

At Greater Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church we never ask our members to do more than the Bible clearly teaches. We only expect our members to do what the Bible expects every Christian to do. These responsibilities are spelled out in the Membership Covenant:

- 1. To attend worship every week unless you are sick or out of town.
- 2. To pursue at least one means of growing your faith in addition to the weekly service.
- 3. To serve in one area of ministry, according to your gifts.
- 4. To grow toward the tithe, giving in proportion to your income.

THE GREATER SHILOH MEMBERSHIP COVENANT


